o-negai-	oh-neh-guy-she-	please do me the favor (of practicing with me).
shimasu	mahs	
domo-	doe-moe-ah-ree-	thank you very much (extra politely). 'domo'
arigato-	gah-toe-goe-	alone also means 'thank you;' 'domo-arigato' is
gozaimasu	zahee-mahs	one level more polite; full phrase is most polite.
Dozo	Doe-zoe	Please, kindly (often said to a new partner)
dojo	doe-joe	a place to practice a martial art
gi	gee (hard "g")	martial arts training uniform
hanmi	hahn-mee	basic standing position, one hand & foot forward
re	ray	bow
seiza	say-zah	kneeling, sitting on heels
sempai	sem-pie	senior student who can mentor junior students
sensei	sen-say	teacher
shikko	sheek-koe	knee walking
shomen	show-men	the front of the dojo (also a strike to the head)
uke	oo-kay	attacker, or person who 'receives' technique
ukemi	oo-keh-mee	rolling and falling ('receiving' energy safely)
yame	yah-may	stop
bokken	bōk-kenn	wooden practice sword
kata	kah-tah	pre-arranged form or sequence of movements
uke	oo-kay	the person who receives the technique; attacker
nage	nah-gay	the person who does the technique; the "winner"
shomen	show-men	cut or strike to the top/front of the head

yokomen	yoe-koe-men	cut or strike to the side of the neck or head
